From the Village President: The Village certainly has seen a busy summer. In speaking with some of the merchants, it seems to have been a successful summer business wise as well. The Day Dock was installed and has seen some usage. The use of the Day Dock is expected to increase next year as the new launch ramp opens on the South Shore. The Village received a \$20,000.00 grant from The Kellogg Foundation to be used for engineering purposes on the new streetscape. Thank you to the Beulah Boosters for their perseverance in acquiring this grant. We reviewed the results of our Energy Audit on the office building and garage at the September Council meeting. The audit showed our building to be quite energy efficient when compared to those of similar construction, but did offer some suggestions for improvement. Our building average cost per square foot for gas and electricity is \$.85 compared to similar building cost average at \$1.36 per square foot. Our Fall Fest was held October 2nd, with many activities in the park. Enjoy the beautiful colors and have a safe Fall Season.

Beulah Boosters Gift Day Dock to Beulah:

Thanks to a loan by a generous Booster, the Beulah Boosters purchased a day dock from MacDonald Marine in Frankfort and gifted it to the Village of Beulah at their July meeting. The dock was installed in August and it has space for 8 watercraft in the slips and bench seating for sunset watchers. The dock's hours are dawn to dusk, no overnight docking. Despite the fun that kids have had running and jumping off the dock, please help us keep the area safe by swimming only in the buoyed area. Shelly Szymanski designed, and along with several Booster volunteers, painted a Welcome to Beulah mural on the end of the bath house building. Efforts are currently underway to raise money to repay the loan. On August 14, Beulah Boosters held a very successful pig roast and dedication ceremony for the new dock. Those wishing to contribute directly to the Beulah Day Dock Fund should make their checks payable to Beulah Boosters Inc. - with memo line stating: Day Dock Fund, and mail to Beulah Boosters Inc., P.O. Box 570, Beulah MI 49617-0570. Beulah Boosters, Inc. has applied for 501 (C) (3) non-profit organization status. Upon approval, your contributions will become 100% tax deductible and you will receive the appropriate written confirmation of your tax deductible gift. Grants Awarded to Beulah: Thanks to the leadership Council member Charley Kinzel and several Beulah Boosters, the Village was awarded a free energy audit this summer from the Northwest Michigan Council of Governments (NWMCoG). The results of the audit helped identify money-saving practices that can be implemented immediately and in the future to make Beulah more 'green'. Additionally, an application was made to NWMCoG and the Kellogg Foundation for a \$20,000 implementation grant to use towards energy saving activities which was awarded to the Village in September. The focus of this grant will be to conduct preliminary

engineering work to forward the plans to update the streetlights along Benzie Blvd. and the sidestreets that lead to Lake Street that will be more attractive and energy efficient. Surveyors from Gosling-Czubak were in town in September working on the project. Work has started on an additional grant that could jump-start the funding process for the proposed streetscape work that was started several years ago with the Beulah Brainstorming meetings. This latest grant is connected again with NWMCoG and the Grand Vision effort.

Public Input Meeting is scheduled for **Tuesday, Nov 2** for public input during the development of the streetscape plan. The public input meeting will be at 7 pm at the Village Office on Commercial St.

Remember:

- **Please don't rake leaves into the street or mulch or mow the leaves in the street. They clog up the storm drains.**
- Tie up your branches and large yard refuse for pick up. Yard waste, leaves, cuttings should be bagged and left street side for pick up. Please keep bags to 25 pounds or less.
- Christmas trees, with their branches bound, can be left curbside for pickup. Smitty's Tree Service, 2741 Benzie Hwy. (across from the Timberline Shell station) will also take trees.
- All dogs in the Village are to be on leash. Only certified service animals are allowed on the Trail. **Please clean up after your pets.**
- Red trash bags are sold at Village Office, yellow at Stapletons (single bags) and Shop & Save (10/pkg). Friday mornings is pick-up for red and yellow bags in the Village. Weekday holidays move pick-up to Saturday morning. Village charges \$21 for 10 red trash bags.
- Business owners and staff are encouraged to park in the parking lots in order to save spaces for visitors and patrons.
- **Please don't feed the birds on the lake.** It will only increase cases of swimmer's itch.

- Snow is coming and must be removed from your sidewalks.
- **No overnight parking on streets ordinance is in effect November 1 to April 1.** Please encourage renters, visitors and everyone to comply with the ordinance to support the Village crews in snow removal. Remember, the ordinance is in effect regardless of snowfall Failure to comply may get your vehicle towed.

School Bus Safety Reminders: The Benzie County Sheriff's Office reminds the motoring public of the need to practice caution when driving. With the start of the school year motorists are reminded of the following: Remember that children are unpredictable in their actions. Take extreme caution when traveling in a school zone. If there are no sidewalks, drive cautiously. Be more alert to the possibility of children walking in the road and playing near school bus stops. Slow down and prepare to stop whenever you see yellow school bus light flashing. Never pass a school bus when there are flashing red lights. This is a sign that children are getting on or off the bus.

Great Lakes Trust Fund/MI-DNRE Grant Status: As reported earlier, the grant application that was submitted for the Lake Street Boardwalk is still under review. A rep from DNRE came this summer and did a walk-through with the committee and identified areas of concern. Efforts to address the concerns have been made and the primary change will be consolidating all the 'rental dock spaces' to the north side of the boat launch, if the grant gets funded. This will make public beach space more evident and align with the boardwalk project. The grant has been resubmitted, notification will be made in January.

New Water Well: Just an update on the new water well project. We have finalized all the paperwork required by the USDA Rural Development to proceed with our new water well. The contract has been awarded and work on the project should begin next month and be completed next spring. This is a new water well to provide sufficient flow and supply to meet our needs for fire protection and water pressure well into the future. While waiting for all the paperwork to be completed, we received a bonus of a reduction of 1/4 percent on the loan for the project which will be significant over the 40 year length of the loan. This will be applied to the quarterly "ready to serve" charge in the amount of \$21.00 per quarter and will be reflected in your current water bill. There will be no disruption of service while the work is being done over the next few months.

Outhouse Races: A new event for the WinterFest on February 11, 2011 will be outhouse races. Favorite activities for many northern towns in the winter, the CLCBA decided to add something new to the day long activities of WinterFest. The Beulah Boosters built a demonstration outhouse which was in the July 4th parade and at several events since to promote interest. Registration sheets will soon be available on the CLCBA website and at State of the Art. Required in the 'outhouse' are a toilet seat and a roll of toilet paper. A

theme will be determined as well as age group categories and divisions for business and non-profit groups. The 'race' will be down Benzie Blvd and winners will be determined on time and design.

New Water Meters: Tired of receiving "estimated" water bills? We are working to overcome this issue. In September we started a trial of 30 new water meters that can be read electronically by a hand held device and downloaded into our computer billing system. We are moving into the 21st century! Currently, it takes our three maintenance personnel three days to manually read each water meter in the Village, a lot of "man-hours"! In the winter months they can't read them at all since they are buried under snow drifts, thus, estimated water bills. The trials have gone well, and hopefully by next year at this time we will have converted every meter in the Village to the new system which will allow the guys to read every meter in town in about 15 minutes, accurately and electronically! This means no more estimated water bills during the two winter quarters and accurate reads every time. New technology is great, isn't it!?
